But wait – there's more – we have moved beyond our neighborhoods to areas around Ohio that are doing ministry but need our resources to help make that happen. Heart Reach Neighborhood Ministries, Dayton Christian Center, our church camps, Race Track Ministries have benefited from our resources. I can't tell you how many times I have had to explain in my own church (you have in yours also) that it is beneficial for us to help with needs beyond our own back door. The children we help in these

ministries could be our next pastor, governor, doctor or neighbor...you get the picture (Acts 1:8). The outer ring of our fellowship goes all the way around the world. We've bought vans in Oklahoma, helped build hospitals in Africa and India. There have been water wells drilled in Haiti. Eye clinics supported in Haiti. They bring health and education to their mission field location. Through those gifts, they bring the greatest gift – the love of Jesus.

All of this sums up our reason for being AB Women. We want to lift up all lives, especially women and through that – share Jesus! So, again, thank you. Thank you for allowing me to be a part of this legacy and ministry. My prayer is for all of you to carry on the ministry of ABW/OH.

In my church I work with the missions, Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. I'm a retired R.N., mother of three and proud grandmother of five.

The medical professionals encourage us to get a physical check-up at least once a year, regular exercise and to eat a proper diet. How many times have you started an exercise program or started a new diet without success? Most success in health and eating
