Hello. How are you doing? Are the tulips blooming in Ohio now? It's been over 100 degrees here in Thailand for the last several weeks, and the smog has been quite oppressive. We are anxiously expecting some rain this week, which will mark the end of our hot, dry season, and should bring the temps down into the 90s.

I wanted to write to express my sincere gratitude for your generous support for my Lesley University degree program. I am thrilled to report that my thesis was approved, and I will be graduating from my program as of May 19th! I have learned a great deal which I am implementing daily in my work at the New Life Center. My internship experience, and the academic challenge of writing my thesis were particularly fulfilling. Lesley U has given me permission to publish the thesis in both English and Thai. I've hired a professor from Chiang Mai University to do the translation for me. I sent her the final version yesterday. I expect to be able to post the Thai version by the end of June.

In other news, we received 4 new residents at the New Life Center over the last 2 months. I have started providing weekly individual art therapy and counseling for them. I'm drawing directly from what I learned while researching for my thesis.

A Message From Rev. Vince Harris

Dear Sisters in Jesus Christ I trust & pray that all is well with you and family.

As for Lois & I, by God's grace & us doing our part, we have gotten over Covid from this winter. I thank God that Lois is well and presently helping a little Latino boy in our community who has an educational disability.

As for yours truly, I just finished doing the meet at Mahoning Valley Racecourse in Austintown, OH., which is 172 miles from our house, so I had to rent an apartment, thank God I was able to get a 6 month lease.

Mahoning Valley Racecourse is in the snow belt, and it was a very cold & bitter winter because all of our people work outside in the stables & on the back side of the race track.

Susan and Wilma Nicholson came to visit, and as I took them on the tour it was very depressing for them to see that this fairly recently built establishment had not built a kitchen for the people who work and live there. Also, they saw the small rooms that two people had to share.

Immediately after Mahoning racing season ended on April 15th, I had to pack my bags and little belongings and head to Thistledown Racetrack in Cleveland Ohio where I am presently the pastor for the people who work and live on the back side. Again, being on the road I had to rent an apartment in Cleveland Close to the racetrack.

Thistledown Racetrack Is 150 miles from our house. Driving 300 miles round trip from my house to Cleveland, or 344 miles to Mahoning is not possible. I am at each track 4 and a 1/2 days one week and 4 days the next.

This is my 27th year being the American Baptist Home Missionary to the racetracks in the state of Ohio. I thank all of you for your prayers, support and most of all, the love that you continue to show me.

Again, thank you so very much for helping me get my diesel truck back in action. Special thanks to Pastor Jill Smith and her congregation for contributing 90% of the total cost of the repairs. The repairs came to a little over \$5000. Amen
