Yearly Goal	Description
\$50,000	<b>White Cross General Fund</b> – used wherever most needed
\$40,000	<b>White Cross Focus Area–Health</b> funds are used to purchase and provide medical supplies and equipment for all of our medical centers and Christian centers around the world.
\$40,000	<b>White Cross Focus Area–Education</b> funds are used to purchase and provide school supplies and educational materials to support a variety of educational programs around the world.
\$10,000	<b>White Cross Focus Area–Human Trafficking</b> funds are used to provide materials used to reach out to women and children affected by human trafficking.
\$9,800	<b>Bolivia</b> – Medical and Dental Supplies for the House of Hope. IM missionaries JD and Rhonda Reed have a vibrant ministry with Bolivian Baptist Churches in the Cochabamba communities through the Bolivian Baptist Union. White Cross funds provide the House of Hope ambulatory clinics with the medical and dental supplies that are needed
\$23,530	<b>Burundi</b> – Education funds will improve literacy for children from the Batwa communities and increase elementary and secondary education graduation rates among this tribal group. We pray for the day when there can be Batwa representatives in the Government of Burundi.
\$9,800	<b>China</b> – Drug Detoxification and Rehab. Baoshan City is located in the southwest part of the Yunnan Province, near the border of China and Myanmar. Drug use is rampant in this area, and many drug users are infected with HIV. White Cross also provides funds for education of children of the affected families.
\$28,334	<b>Democratic Republic of the Congo</b> – Medical Supplies, Nurses' Training and Transportation. IM missionary Katherine Niles and our partners in the Baptist Community of Congo (CBCO) use White Cross funds throughout their network of hospitals and health centers to support the training of nurses and doctors. They also distribute medications and hospital supplies such as uniforms, diabetic testing supplies, surgical gowns and scrubs, gauze, surgical gloves, etc. purchased in the U.S. and sent to the Congo.
\$35,000	<b>Democratic Republic of the Congo</b> – Shipping of hand goods, birthing baby kits
\$3,921	<b>Dominican Republic</b> – Kits \$12.00 per kit provides Hygiene Kits with basic supplies.
\$9,800	<b>Dominican Republic</b> – Food, School Supplies and more. IM missionary Rev. Madeline Flores-López works with three associations: the Asociacion Bautista Vida Eterna, Inc., the Asociacion Bautista Misionera Haitiana, Inc. and the Aprendamos ministries. White Cross funds help purchase school supplies, medications, food, baby items and health kits for struggling families, especially women and children.
\$7,059	<b>El Salvador</b> – Senior Home and Education. The Baptist women in El Salvador support social ministries through White Cross in the areas of family life, health care and provision for the needs of senior citizens. The Senior Home and other projects are important to those in El Salvador. The women help to maintain the Baptist schools in Santa Ana and San Salvador and promote good health and community projects.
\$12,942	<b>Haiti</b> – Sewing and Education, Eye Care and Student Infirmary. This project is managed by IM missionaries Nzunga Mabudiga and Kihomi Ngwemi.
\$17,250	<b>Hungary</b> – The bilingual program is open to all students, but there are expenses for extra books and a final language exam that create quite a hardship on families. If students pass that exam it will help them get into good high schools and universities. Your gifts provide teaching materials, textbooks, field trips and cultural experiences during the school year, and help with stipends for teachers.

\$29,412	<b>India</b> – Hospitals, Clinics and Mobile Units. The Council of Baptist Churches in Northeast India and Interchurch Service Association provide much-needed medical care to rural villages through hospitals, clinics and mobile units.
\$5,883	<b>Lebanon</b> – Medical and Dental Care for Seminary Students. The Arab Baptist Theological Seminary is in partnership with IM helping seminary students with medical and dental needs. The seminary also provides Syrian refugee children
\$11,764	<b>Liberia</b> – Ricks Institute. Liberia Baptist Missionary and Educational Convention, in partnership with IM, supports the Ricks Institute, an educational institution for children from kindergarten to grade 12. White Cross provides a balanced and integrated education of head, heart and hand and sponsors a nutritional
\$11,764	<b>Myanmar</b> – Medical Care and Food Projects. Myanmar Baptist Convention (Burma) has set up clinics and “mini hospitals” in different parts of the country and along the border of China to offer medical assistance through White Cross funds. Christian doctors and nurses volunteer their time to serve in these facilities.
\$17,647	<b>Nepal</b> – Nepal Hospital and Medical Camps. IM missionary Carole Sydnor works with the Chaurjahari Hospital, which serves over 700,000 people from three districts in the Midwestern Region.
\$32,295	<b>Nicaragua</b> – Medical Supplies, Medicine and Training Health Promoters. IM missionaries Drs. David and Laura Parajón serve through AMOS Health and Hope, which seeks to improve the health of poor and marginalized people in rural communities. AMOS provides health workers (promoters) to treat and assist in delivery of healthy babies and medicine for preventable disease. Your gifts reduce the death rate of children in poverty by providing health care in the most rural and distant communities and assist new moms with service support and medicines.
\$3,529	<b>Palestine</b> – Food and Medicine for Refugees. Christian Mission to Gaza supports the relief work of Dr. Hanna Massad, the pastor of this area’s only evangelical church. Christian Mission to Gaza provides school uniforms for children in order to go to school and food and medicine to Palestinian refugees suffering from malnutrition and poverty
\$5,882	<b>Panama</b> – IM missionary Ingrid Roldán-Román uses White Cross funds to provide medical treatment, milk, blankets, diapers, school supplies, uniforms and shoes for children in the School Tutoring Program who live in the banana plantation community. Many of their families are very poor but desire
\$7,843	<b>Philippines</b> – Kits for four Christian Centers \$10.00 per Kit will provide 2000 Kits; Hygiene, Baby Layette, school Kits, etc.
\$5,882	<b>Philippines</b> – The Philippine Baptist Convention serves two hospitals that provide general primary care as well as delivering health education through a mobile team.
\$23,530	<b>South Africa</b> – Health Kits for Health Builders. IM missionaries Drs. Rick and Anita Gutierrez bring health care to remote areas. They use White Cross Funds to provide health kits—which contain portable HIV tests, sugar strips, glucometers, lancets, blood pressure cuffs and stethoscopes—to the Health Builders that they train.
\$5,883	<b>Thailand</b> – Hospital services often mean the difference between life and death for those who are sick and injured. White Cross in Thailand provides medical treatment supplies, as well as nutrition
\$5,883	<b>Uganda</b> – Village2Village to provide safety for orphans and vulnerable children along with providing opportunity for education.
