As your president, I have attended national board meetings, "What's happening ABW?" events and several webinars. Ladies, these have been educational, inspirational, and just good experiences. Our website, www.abwmohio.org is being updated as I write, and you can register for upcoming webinars from right on the front page. They have been very good and there is no cost unless you want to donate. If you go to the national website, you can watch past webinars such as "Embracing the Beauty of Divine Chaos" and "Soulcare for Her". The next "What's Happening" for the Midwest Region is March 13 at 8:00pm. This, too, is not just for presidents. Any woman can join in and both share what their church or association is

doing and hear what others are doing. You might get good ideas. I encourage you to try out some of these webinars and other events. Producing these events is one of the ways National uses our Women and Girls Fund donations for us. Take advantage of them. I know this is a long article, but I think you will find this next part interesting, so please keep reading.

Earlier this month was my Lydia Circle meeting. For our program, Debby shared the cover page of the December 24-25 weekend Wall Street Journal's "Review" section. The

article by Rebecca McLaughlin, a Christian apologist from the U.K., was called "When Mary Met the Angel". The article sets the story of the angel's announcement to Mary against the historical Jewish and Roman backdrop and follows the effect of Christianity from that day to this. Per McLaughlin, the idea of a human child conceived by God would have been quite acceptable to the Romans, whose deities often spawned human children. But to Jews who believed you could not even look on God and live, the idea would have been ludicrous and deadly-blasphemous, especially a "virgin" birth.

To the Romans, Mary's message of a "king's birth" would have been a seditious threat. Followers of such claims—and their families and villages—would have been quickly eradicated with ruthless force. No Roman or Jew would have taken the word of a woman seriously. And yet, God's message regarding a virgin-born savior was delivered to a woman. And another Mary was the first to testify about the empty tomb.

Christianity, even today, is largely female: unlike Islam, Hinduism, etc. Today, even though Christianity in the U.S. is sadly said to be declining, Christians still represent the largest global religion: 31% of humans say they are Christians. And despite those who say Christianity is a white Western religion, Christianity has been multiethnic from the start. McLaughlin states that, "Today, Christians are by far the world's most racially and culturally diverse religious group." "By 2060", McLaughlin predicts, "40% of the world's Christians

could live in sub-Saharan Africa. [And] Though China is today the global center of atheism, there will soon be more Christians in China than in the U.S."

McLaughlin makes the case that Christianity is also supportable by science. She quotes one particular Christian scientist, who defines science as "the description of how God chooses to work most of the time." When Jesus rose from the dead, God was "doing something different", which is His prerogative as Creator.

The Greeks and Romans cared nothing for the poor, and slavery was a fact of life. In contrast, Jesus championed the poor and lowly, and Christianity was often called the religion of slaves. Despite our history of slavery, Christianity was the force behind its eradication, first in Europe and finally in the U.S. And it should be noted that Christianity has been a driving force in founding hospitals, providing nongovernmental poverty relief, and heading up anti-human trafficking endeavors, among other things.

In conclusion, McLaughlin addresses why God chose to become a man. She quotes Christian Scripture and doctrine to say that God chose to become a man because of love for every human being. "[God] paid the price for human sin – a word we may not choose to use but a reality we hit upon when we bewail injustice...and wonder why it seems so hard to fix." McLaughlin quotes Christian doctrine to say that when Jesus died, He did so, "so that all who trust in him could live as sons and daughters of God."

Finally, she says that if Mary was right about her son, "then [we] are worth the birth and life and death and resurrection of the Son of God." Debby suggested that with Satan diligently working to erase Christ from our national discourse, we need to concentrate on missions and evangelism in our own country as well as globally. I agree. And that is just what ABW Ministries is trying to do through their work with women and girls in the United States and Puerto Rico.
